For safety reasons the green gate by reception will be locked at all times apart from the beginning and end of the day. LABEL ALL BELONGINGS

As the cold and wet weather approaches please could you ensure that your child has appropriate clothing. We provide waterproof trousers, could you please ensure your child has wellies and slippers if you wish; we like to play out whatever the weather. Please could you provide your child with a hat, scarf and mittens/gloves as the weather is getting colder? Also Velcro fastening shoes.

Please remember to label all clothes, shoes, wellies, drinks bottles and lunch boxes as we have lots of duplicates

SPARE CLOTHES

We do have a supply of spare clothes but please ensure your child has a set of their own clothes especially if they are in the process of toilet training. If your child is in nappies please ensure that your child has enough supplies for their session.

LUNCH CLUB

All grapes, tomatoes, sausages, blueberries etc. need to be chopped in half, length ways to prevent choking. We have recently found that tangerines/satsumas also pose a risk, if you are providing any fruit it should be chopped into really small pieces.

Please check that yoghurt and drinks caps are also not too small as they may cause a choking hazard.

Could we please ask that lunch boxes are cleaned inside and outside as they are put in the fridge and on the tables where the children eat their food. Most lunch boxes are ok to go through the washing machine.

Please see attached information from the Food Standards Agency, this provides vital information regarding choking.

CLOSING THE WORD GAP

At Pavilion we are committed and strive for the best start for all of the children who are in our care. The Early Years Teacher team provide lots of resources and useful information to support our aim to close the word gap. As part of their new campaign to encourage children's speech and vocabulary they have launched "Walk and Talk".
